Miguel Ángel Ortiz was 14 years old when he and his mother were detained by border agents. His story: His father was fleeing the violence of Mexico's drug war. His family's life in the United States is broken. And his voice has no place. One in every 15 children currently in the U.S. immigration system was separated from a parent at the border, according to the American Civil Liberties Union. At least 438 children have been reunited with a parent since the Trump administration's zero-tolerance policy was implemented in April. The practice of separating families is, however, far more complicated than simply reuniting the parent and child. Ortiz, 17, is undocumented and one of the youngest people to tell his story in "Together Again," a one-hour documentary from the ACLU. A native of Oaxaca, Mexico, Ortiz became a U.S. citizen at the age of 6, but his immigration story is an example of a close family separated because of President Trump's zero tolerance policy. "My father was a single parent," Ortiz told The Huffington Post in an email. "He was fleeing violence in Oaxaca and had left my mother behind, but we would still see him and talk to him on the phone on a regular basis.

When he was deported, my mother told me that he was taken away by U.S. Border Patrol agents.” “I remember being told that I couldn’t go back to school because I didn’t have an ID. I had no idea how I could get an ID, and I didn’t know if my mom could go to the Department of Motor Vehicles and get it,” he said.
